# Where will your Journey go?

Excellence is the BSA's council performance recognition program designed to encourage and reward success and measure the performance of units, districts, and councils. It replaced the Centennial Quality Awards program as a means of encouraging excellence in providing a quality program at all levels of the BSA.

It provides you:

- •A framework for evaluating your Pack
- ·Assessment of how you're doing in the key areas found in great Packs
- •Guidance in areas where you might do better
- Specific guidelines and standards of what is good

performance

- •Early warning of potential problem areas
- •Recognition for your good performance
- ·Benchmarking to get ideas and tips from other good units

Each year the criteria for the award changes slightly. For 2013, training requirements are different and ScoutStrong is now in the physical fitness criterion.

Units can achieve one of three levels of the Journey to Excellence; Bronze, Silver, or Gold. What makes a "Gold" unit? A Gold unit is one where Scouts are advancing, leaders are trained and both participate in a variety of out-

door programs. But it's more than that. A gold unit is one where Scouts and their families provide meaningful community service and where Scouts are regularly recognized for their achievements. Gold units are those that plan and carryout an exciting year-round program that retains Scouts and attracts new youth.

Does this sound like your unit? Then you are probably on track to earn the Gold level of the Journey to Excellence. Way to go. Your Scouts will be able to proudly wear the Gold recognition on their uniform. If not, there is no time like the present to get on track.

# ScoutBook Transfer Tip

ooner or later you will need to transfer Scouts from one unit to another. Webelos crossover to Boy Scouts and others may move.

- 1. If the new unit has a Scoutbook subscription, add the new leader as a Connection to the Scout with Full Control permissions. The new leader now has enough control over the Scout's account to make any changes to his account.
- 2. The new leader can now log into Scoutbook and switch the unit of each Scout to the new unit. To do this just edit the profile of each Scout and select the new unit. Make sure to check the Approve checkbox when updating the new unit.

3. The new leader can then go through each Scouts' Connections and remove any old connections that no longer are active. This includes the old leader's connection to the Scout. If the Scout is connected to his parents/guardians those connections should remain in tact.

#### OTHER NOTES:

- If the new unit is not using Scoutbook make sure you have at least one parent connected with Full Control to the Scouts account.
- NEVER delete a Scout record because you simply want to transfer him out of your subscription! Doing so will delete all advancement data and notes on the Scout's account.
